Introduction:

In the contemporary world, the exercise of power transcends traditional military and economic might. Soft power, as conceptualized by Joseph Nye, refers to the ability to shape the preferences of others through appeal and attraction rather than coercion or force. India's rich cultural heritage, democratic values, and growing global presence provide a fertile ground for the exercise of soft power. Over the years, India has utilized cultural diplomacy, educational exchanges, and the global influence of its diaspora to project itself as a benign and attractive power on the world stage.

India's soft power diplomacy gained momentum under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who keenly emphasized India's rich cultural heritage. Initiatives such as the International Day of Yoga, cultural and spiritual linkages, and the influence of the Indian diaspora globally highlight this focus. Bollywood, festivals, cuisine, educational exchanges, humanitarian assistance, and public diplomacy have further bolstered India's soft power. This multidimensional approach enables India to project its values and ideals on the global stage, fostering relationships grounded in mutual respect and shared interests. India's soft power diplomacy represents a significant facet of its foreign policy, reflecting its aspirations as a global power. By anchoring its cultural heritage, educational resources, and humanitarian efforts, India can enhance its influence and strengthen international partnerships.

The international seminar on "India's Emerging Soft Power: Strategic Dimensions and Global Outreach "aims to explore and critically examine the elements of India's soft power strategy , its implementation , and its effectiveness in the global arena . It will explore various sub-themes, including the philosophical and strategic foundations of India's soft power, opportunities and challenges in a changing world, leveraging multilateral institutions, and the roles of key agencies and institutional frameworks . The APA6 style may be used for referencing.
