Republic Day Celebrated

On 26 January 2017, Mahatma Gandhi Central University Bihar celebrated its first Republic Day. On this occasion, the Chief Guest, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Prof. (Dr) Arvind Agrawal, hoisted the National Flag in the Camp Office of the University at Raghunathpur and in the TempCamp of the University in Zila School. Addressing the faculty members, students and non-teaching staff, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr) Arvind Agrawal said that it was an auspicious occasion to remember those who had sacrificed their lives in the Indian freedom struggle. He recalled his last flag hoisting on the occasion of Independence Day on 15 August 2016 when no teachers were recruited and no students registered. He had promised himself that he would celebrate the Republic Day on 26 January 2017 along with the registered students and the recruited teachers of the University.



Hoisting the tricolour, amidst the students, faculty and the non-teaching members of the University on the 68th Republic Day, he fulfilled that promise that he had made to himself.

Prof. (Dr) Arvind Agrawal mentioned that the University is in a nascent stage and acknowledged the contributions of those faculty and staff who had worked day in and day out for the development of the University. On this occasion Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor expressed his hope that the State Government would hand over the notification of land acquisition for the permanent campus before the first anniversary of the University's Foundation Day on 03rd February, 2017. First Mid-Term Exam Conducted



The mid-term examinations of the first academic session of Mahatma Gandhi Central University Bihar were held from 26 December 2016 to 30 December 2016 in two sessions, viz. 10 am to 12 noon and 2 pm to 4 pm. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr) Arvind Agrawal instructed the students regarding the rules and regulations of the exam on the last teaching day, 24 December 2016. For the smooth conduct of the exami-

nation and to prevent any use of unfair means, the University left no stone unturned. Only students with valid ID cards were allowed entry to the campus. The students were then thoroughly frisked at the second entry point by a frisking team consisting of both male and female faculty members. Students could enter the examination hall only 15 minutes prior to the commencement of the examination and they were not allowed to leave the hall before 10 minutes to the completion of the examination. A flying squad inspected each examination hall for checking cases of malpractice. The students were provided water facility within the examination halls. The University also made necessary arrangements for providing medical facility to the candidates.

On the second day of the examination,

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor took the media personnel on a tour of the university and acquainted them with the process of examination. After the tour, a press conference was held in the University campus in which Hon'ble Vice Chancellor applauded the efforts of all the students, teaching faculty and non-teaching staff for the smooth conduct of the examination. He said, **"Be it Sunday or Monday, each day is a working day for the University family."**

As the entire examination was conducted without a single case of use of unfair means, Mr Banmali Singh, Controller of Examination, Dr Amrendra Tripathi and Dr S. K. Tripathi, the Centre Superintendents also thanked all the faculty and staff involved in the examination.

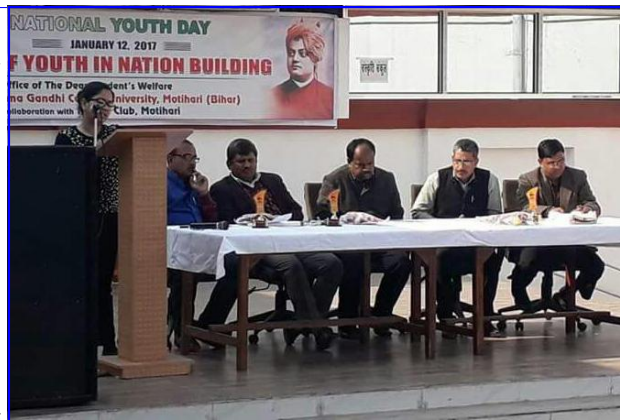

Grant Proposal Accepted by ICMR



A research grant proposal to Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), Government of India made by **Dr Arttrana Pal**, Associate Professor, Department of Zoology has been accepted. The title of the research project is '**Oxidative damage to cell organelle and its relationship to diabetic retinopathy**'.

This research project proposes that although diabetic retinopathy is a common complication of diabetes, we still know very little about the underlying molecular mechanisms.

This project would demonstrate a robust augmentation by high glucose enhances the oxidative stress and organelles dysfunctions leading to inflammation, retinal degeneration, and changes in neuronal cells, elucidating a fresh consideration of novel mechanism potentially involved in hyperglycemia boosts gene expression intricate in mitochondrial dysfunction, inflammation, neuropathy, and retinopathy.

MGCUB Faculty to Present Papers in Bangkok Conference



Two Assistant Professors of Mahatma Gandhi Central University Bihar have been selected to present their research papers in the prestigious *Interdisciplinary International Conference on Development, Environment and Social Welfare: Issues and Challenges* to be held during 16 & 17 May 2017 in Bangkok, Thailand. The conference will be held in Phranakhon Rajabhat University, Bangkok, Thailand. **Dr Dinesh Vyas**, Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology & Social Anthropology will present his paper titled *Inclusive Education in India & Human Rights for Disabled Child*. **Ms. Alka Lalhall**, Assistant Professor, Department of Management Sciences will present her paper titled "**Workplace Culture and career Progression of Women Bank Employees in Himachal Pradesh**". The papers will highlight various social issues concerning gender, disability and organizational communication.



Book Chapter Authored by Faculty



Dr Pranveer Singh, Associate Professor, Department of Zoology, Mahatma Gandhi Central University Bihar, authored a book chapter entitled '**AIDS: Spread the knowledge, not the Virus**' for the book *Advances in Animal Sciences and Biomedicine in 21st Century* published by International academy of Biosciences (IAB), England and Wales, United Kingdom.

The book deals with the latest trends in diagnosis, surveillance and monitoring of disease and

developing effective and novel vaccines neutralizing pathogens. The contributed chapter provides holistic details of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), ranging from taxonomic status, subtypes, super-infection, human-HIV interface, history and origin, symptoms that involve whole body, mode of spread, diagnosis, treatment (issues of drug / vaccine), myths and stigma associated with the disease, social dynamics and finally the signals from the wild.

Special Lecture Delivered by Faculty

Dr Devdutt Chaturvedi, Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry, School of Physical & Material Sciences, was invited to deliver an expert lecture on "**Greener and Efficient Approaches for the Syntheses of Biologically Potent Scaffolds**" in the international conference on *Structure and Dynamics of Biomolecules* organised by Deen Dayal Upadhyay University, Gorakhpur on 27 and 28 January, 2017. In his talk, Dr Chaturvedi focused on some of his recent research work for the development of novel and efficient synthetic methodologies for biologically potent molecules employing cheap and safe alternatives such as CO₂ and CS₂ respectively.



Major Research Project Transferred to MGCUB



Dr Rafique Ul Islam, Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry, School of Physical & Material Sciences, got a major research project transferred to MGCUB on 18 January 2017.

The transferred project is entitled "**Synthesis, Characterisation and Catalytic Application of Supported Metal Nano-Particles in Carbon-Carbon Bond Formation**" with the duration of 3 years which will be continued up to 31-08-2018. The total sanctioned amount of the project is INR

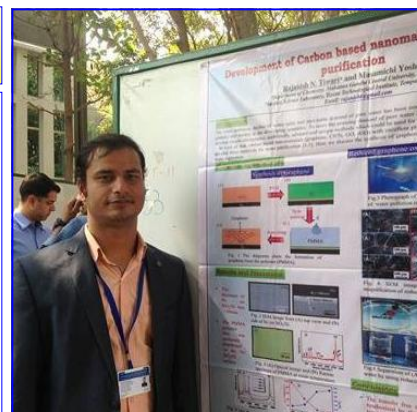
28,06,400. The projected is funded by Science & Engineering Research Board (SERB), Govt. of India under startup research grant scheme for young scientists.

In this regard, a research laboratory will be established soon in MGCUB premises along with the equipments and consumables for the project. The aim of the project is the generation of newer catalysts for the application in organic synthesis.

Faculty Attends DST Inspire Faculty Meet

Inspire Faculty Awardee **Dr Rajanish N. Tiwari**, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry, MGCUB presented his work at DST Inspire Faculty meet which was held from 16 to 17 January, 2017 in KIIT University, Bhubaneshwar, Odisha. His research topic was "**Development of carbon based Nanomaterials for water purification**".

It is well known that carbon is a good absorbent. He discussed the allotropes of Carbon Nanomaterials such as graphene synthesis by thermal annealing process as well as fabrication of reduced graphene oxide (rGO) by chemical method. He synthesised rGO and used it in the separation of water from mixtures of oil-water and in treatment of waste water. His research work is associated with "SWACHH BHARAT" (Clean India) campaign run by the Government of India to clean water.



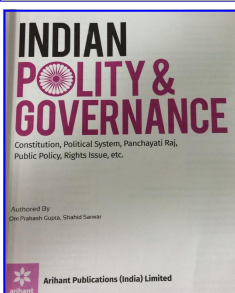
Paper Presented by Faculty



Dr Sheo Kumar Singh, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Mathematics, participated in an International Conference entitled "International Conference of The Indian Mathematics Consortium (TIMC) in Cooperation with American Mathematical Society (AMS)" organised by DST-Centre for Interdisciplinary Mathematical Sciences, Institute of Science, Banaras Hindu University during 14-17 December 2016. He also presented a paper entitled "**Disconnectedness in The Category Q-TOP**".

In his paper, Dr Singh briefly discussed the concepts of connectedness and disconnectedness for Q -topological spaces with respect to a class of Q -topological spaces motivated by the works of G. Preuss, Arhangel'skii and Wiegandt. He also showed in his paper that the sub-class of T_0 - Q -topological spaces is a disconnectedness.

Book Authored by Faculty



Mr Om Prakash Gupta, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science and International Relations, Mahatma Gandhi Central University Bihar authored a book titled **Indian Polity and Governance** by reputed publisher Arihant. The book provides an analysis of conceptual facts of the Indian Constitution, governance and politics, and the contemporary spectrum of the constitutional provisions. It emphasizes on the elements of policy making and governance. The book will be immensely helpful for the aspirants of the Civil Services Examination (Prelims) and State PCS and other competitive examinations.



Paper Published by Faculty



Dr Pawan Kumar, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, published a research paper titled "**High Temperature Magnetic Behaviour of 10% Aluminium Substituted Cobalt Ferrite**" "*Journal of Superconductivity and Novel Magnetism*" which is a peer reviewed International Journal. The paper discusses temperature dependent magnetization analysis of nanocrystalline cobalt ferrite which is a centro-symmetric magnetic material. It shows the negligible inter-

particle interaction in the sample. The presence of ferrimagnetic order is shown by Arrott plot analysis. ZFC and FC magnetization measurement shows that the blocking temperature is far above the room temperature. The magnetocrystalline anisotropy constant was determined by employing the "law of approach (LA) to saturation" theory. The saturation magnetization, magnetocrystalline anisotropy constant and coercivity are found to decrease with the increase in temperature.

All the teachers of Department of Botany, MGCUB (**Dr Pratibha Singh, Dr Alok Shrivastava, Dr Durgeshwar Singh and Dr Tara Chand Ram**) visited Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) Piprakothi on 12th January 2017. KVK, Piprakothi is located near Muzaffarpur-Lucknow NH28, 11 km away from Motihari. The visit was conducted to examine the site for field visit of students as part of their course. It is in their syllabus to perform a field visit and make a report of 15 marks. The faculty also interacted with the head of the KVK regarding agricultural crops being produced in this region of Bihar. They also gathered information about various economically important crops hitherto unexplored scientifically which can provide raw data for research.

The Mahatma Gandhi Central University was established under the Central Universities (Amendment) Act 2014 [No. 35 of 2014] of Indian Parliament, which received the assent of the Hon'ble President of India on the 17th December 2014. The University became functional w.e.f. 3rd February 2016 with the assumption of charge by Prof. (Dr) Arvind Agrawal as its First & Founder Vice-Chancellor.

The Mahatma Gandhi Central University is located at Motihari, District – East Champaran, Bihar. Motihari is the “KARAMBHOOMI” of the father of the nation, where he successfully experimented with the idea of “SATYAGRAH” during the “NEEL ANDOLAN” at Champaran in 1917. Establishment of Mahatma Gandhi Central University commemorates centenary of the Gandhi’s Satyagrah and stepping on this land.

The salient feature of the University is its unique and innovative curricular framework which is comparable to the best Universities of the world. All Programmes of Studies are planned to be modular with lateral exit and entry and are inherently multi-disciplinary, thereby enabling students to make their own basket of courses to complete their chosen Programme of Studies. The University has adopted Semester System incorporating Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and Comprehensive Continuous Internal Assessment. The focus is to help students realise their full potential and acquire knowledge, values and skill sets and develop aptitude required for the contemporary world of work.

The University presently has seven Schools and fifteen Departments offering various twelve Undergraduate (UG) and two Postgraduate (PG) Programmes of Studies.

The University will have its own campus on 302 acres of land near Bankat-Bairiya village at Motihari, District – East Champaran (BIHAR) to be made available by the State Government of Bihar.

The present Academic Programmes and activities of the University are being run from Temporary Campus (TempCamp) in the premises of Zila School at Motihari provided by the State Government on rent basis. The Administrative functions of the University are run from hired building named as ‘Camp Office’ at Raghunathpur, Motihari.
